LOCATION: Oak Ridge, Tennessee

RULES: In accordance with the current edition of the CMP Service rulebook. All Service Rifle EIC

matches are governed by CMP rules and are conducted as National Trophy Rifle Events.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all eligible participants. You need not be a member of the NRA or CMP affiliated

club to participate.

FEES: \$25.00 (Junior \$15.00)

Entries accepted to range capacity prior to the first relay each day. There must be at least 6 non-distinguished competitors in order to qualify as an EIC match. Priority will be given to non-distinguished shooters. Competitors who wish to shoot out of competition must declare their intention prior to firing their first shot.

RIFLE and Sights: Service or Alternative Rifle as defined in the current edition of the CMP Highpower Rifle and Pistol Competition Rulebook rules 4.1.1 to 4.1.4

AMMUNITION: Any safe ammunition appropriate for the rifle being used rule 4.4.1. No tracer, incendiary, armor piercing, or penetrator steel core ammo may be used. All ammunition to be furnished by the competitor.

TARGETS: SR, SR3, and MR1 targets will be used.

SQUADDING: All matches will be squadded beginning at 8am the day of the match. Squadding closes at 8:30.

FIRING TIME: 9:00 am Eastern Time (See special addendum on page 2 for October 5th match)

SCORING: Competitors will pull targets and score for other relays.

CHALLENGES: A fee of two Dollars will be charged in advance for each challenge.

Course of Fire: Service Rifle 50 shot National Match Course no sighting shots (CMP rules 6.4 & 9.3.3)

200yds, slow fire, standing, 10 shots, 10 minutes.

200yds, rapid fire, standing to sitting or kneeling with magazine change, 10 shots, 60 seconds.

300yds, rapid fire, standing to prone with magazine change, 10 shots, 70 seconds.

600yds, slow fire, prone, 20 shots, 20 minutes.

AWARDS: Gold, Silver and Bronze Place medals will be presented to the top three competitors (Distinguished or non-Distinguished) Gold, Silver and Bronze Achievement Pins will be presented to competitors equaling or exceeding Achievement Award Scores. Points are awarded by CMP to any non-Distinguished who place in the top ten percent of non-Distinguished shooters, provided the score fired by the competitor equals or exceeds the EIC minimum credit score (rule 10.2).

NOTES: The June 2nd EIC match will be held in conjunction with the NRA regional tournament. All other EIC matches will be standalone EIC competitions. The management reserves the right to refuse any entry or cause the withdrawal of any competitor who endangers or interferes in any way with the harmony of the match. We also reserve the right to change the match program without notice if deemed advisable. Competitors and spectators assume all risk of accident and loss of property.

<u>DIRECTIONS TO THE RANGE:</u> The ORSA range is located on the Oak Ridge Turnpike (State Route 95) 3.5 miles west of the intersection with Illinois Ave. (State Route 62) and the Turnpike. The range entrance is the first road on the left after stop light no. 16 at Nebraska Ave.

Special Addendum for Saturday October 5th match only.

There will be an optional squadded practice held the morning of Saturday October 5th prior to firing the EIC match. The squadded practice will begin at 9am and will be fired in two relays.

Relay 1

200yds, slow fire, taken from any position, unlimited shots, 10 minute time limit.

Relay 2

200yds, slow fire, taken from any position, unlimited shots, 10 minute time limit. 600yds, slow fire, prone, unlimited shots, 10 minute time limit.

Relay 1

600yds, slow fire, prone, unlimited shots, 10 minute time limit.

After squadded practice firing is complete the range will be reset and competitors will have a short break.

Estimated firing time for the 50 shot EIC match on Saturday is 11:00 am ET. Please note competitor registration and squadding still needs to be completed by 8:30 am even if you choose not to participate in the squadded practice.

Sunday October 6th EIC match will begin at 9am ET. There will be no squadded practice on Sunday.
