

Oak Ridge Sportsmen's Association Civilian Marksmanship Program 2024 Highpower Rifle Clinics With Garand and Modern Military Matches

Saturday 20 April Saturday 21 September

LOCATION: Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The ORSA range is located at 2625 Oak Ridge Turnpike (State Route 95), 3.5 miles west of the intersection with Illinois Ave. (State Route 62). The range entrance is just west of the stop light at Nebraska Ave and Turtle Park. Bear right through the gate, turn right at the top of the hill and the indoor range will be on your right at the range complex.

ELIGIBILITY: Space is limited, registration required. Participants who have not previously fired in either CMP or NRA high power rifle competition must complete at least one CMP Highpower Rifle Clinic before firing a highpower rifle event at ORSA. <u>Prior attendance to a Basic Clinic is required.</u>

ENTRY FEES: Clinic; \$40 for AR-15 or \$50 for M1 Garand if using ORSA rifle and ammo, \$10 if using your own equipment. Match following the clinic \$10, plus \$20 for AR ammo or \$40 for Garand ammo if needed.

REGISTRATION and Classroom Topics: 8:00 am at the ORSA Indoor Range.

HIGHPOWER CLINIC TOPICS: Will build upon the Basic Clinic topics and provide more in depth discussion on the following topics:

- 1. Safety & Range Procedures during competitions.
- 2. Rifles & Equipment
- 3. Courses of Fire, Scoring & Pulling Targets during matches.
- 4. Equipment Issue

CLINIC SCHEDULES: Immediately following the classroom instruction, each participant will be paired with an experienced coach for range instruction and match shooting. Range instruction will include the following topics (concurrent with shooting):

- 1. Practice Prone, Sitting, & Standing Positions Equipment and Sling Use
- 2. Zeroing and Sight Alignment
- 3. Range instruction will consist of shooting slow-fire prone, rapid-fire prone, rapid-fire sitting, and slow-fire standing from 200 yards.

RIFLES: Highpower clinic participants must use a M1 Garand or modern military M1A1 or AR-15 rifles as described in current CMP Games Rifle and Pistol Competition Rules.5.2.2 and 5.2.4. Other modern military rifle platforms are <u>not</u> eligible for these clinics. ORSA has both AR-15 and M1 Garand match rifles, ammunition, and accessories available for use. Please contact David Kiefer with any questions about rifle eligibility or to request a club rifle.

AMMUNITION: Any safe ammunition may be used for the clinic and match, in accordance with CMP Competition Rules. Ammunition for club rifles will be provided. Ammunition for the Garand and Modern Military Match is available for additional cost beyond the clinic fees if you are borrowing club equipment and rifles. Surplus Lake City M2 ammo (.30-06) is \$40 for 35 rounds, and .223 ammo for the AR is \$20 for 35 rounds.

GARAND AND MODERN MILITARY MATCH

Clinic participants, coaches, and other competitors are invited to shoot the CMP-sanctioned Garand and Modern Military Match after the clinics. Squadding will begin approximately 12:00 pm immediately after the clinic. Clinic participants may use their clinic rifle and gear.

REGISTRATION AND SQUADDING

Squadding for the matches will take place immediately after the clinics, approximately **12:00 pm at the 200-yard line**.

MATCH SCHEDULE:

Course of Fire: As-Issued Military Rifle Match Course A (Rule 4.5, Table 3). All stages are fired from 200 yards on the SR target.

- Stage 1, 5 sighters and 10 record shots slow fire prone in 15 minutes
- *Stage 2*, 10 shots rapid fire prone from standing in 80 seconds.
- Stage 3, 10 shots slow fire standing in 10 minutes.

CMP ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

CMP Achievement Awards will be awarded to competitors shooting qualified scores. Current award scores can be found in Annex G of the current *CMP Games Rifle and Pistol Competition Rules*.
