CMP Sanctioned High Power Rifle Championship

SPONSOR: Oak Ridge Sportsmen's Association **ELIGIBILITY:** Open to all eligible participants. You need not be a member of the NRA or a CMP affiliated club to participate.

COURSE OF FIRE: Each day squadding is from 8:00 AM EDT to 8:25 AM in the clubhouse. Firing begins at 9:00 AM.

Thursday May 30, 2024 Squadded Practice

Friday May 31, 4 x 50 Team Match

Saturday June 1, 80 Shot CMP Cup Match

Sunday June 2, EIC match and concurrently 50 shot National Match Course

RULES: Current CMP Rifle Competition Rules will apply

FEES:

Thursday Squadded Practice/ USAMU Clinic \$5 fee per participant to cover range supplies.

Friday Team Match \$40 per team

Saturday Championship Fee (Matches 1-7) \$60 adults / \$40 juniors.

Sunday CMP EIC Leg or National Match Course \$25 adults / \$15 juniors

ENTRIES: Advance entries are encouraged to aid in tournament planning and logistics. Entries are limited to 150 individuals / 30 teams and will close on the Monday before the tournament. Post entries will be accepted to range capacity, provided that such entries do not require the squadding of extra relays. Cancellations made before the closing date will be refunded in full. Competitors entering the entire tournament will be given preference.

Entry in individual matches may be made using the attached registration card, accompanied by a check or money order for the full amount of individual match fees. Credit cards will be accepted on site prior to squadding.

TEAM ENTRIES: Notice of intention to enter teams may be made on site. Teams will consist of 4 firing members from the same organization. Pick-up teams will be allowed to accommodate unaffiliated competitors. A team captain must be named, but may be a firing member of the team.

DIRECTIONS TO THE RANGE: The ORSA range is located at 2625 Oak Ridge Turnpike (State Route 95), 3.5 miles west of the intersection of Illinois Ave. (State Route 62) and the Turnpike. The range entrance is the first road on the left beyond Nebraska Ave.

CHECK IN AND SQUADDING: Competitors may check in at the ORSA Clubhouse between 7:30 and 8:30 AM each day. Competitors who fail to be at the proper firing point when their relay is called may lose their privilege to compete in that event.

CLASSIFICATION: The CMP Classification system will be used in all matches. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master class. CMP recognizes NRA classifications if competitor does not have a CMP classification.

CATEGORIES: Two categories, Civilian and Service, will be recognized within each division. The Service category will include Regular Service, Reserve, and National Guard. All others will compete as civilians.

RIFLE: Match Rifle or Service Rifle.

AMMUNITION: provided by the competitor.

TARGETS: SR at 200 yards, SR-3 at 300 yards, MR-1 at 600 yards.

SCORING AND PIT OPERATION: Competitors and teams will be required to perform scoring and pit operation duties.

CHALLENGES: A fee of \$3.00 will be collected **IN ADVANCE** for each challenge.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: The management reserves the right to refuse any entry or cause the withdrawal of any competitor who endangers or interferes in any way with the harmony of the match. We also reserve the right to change the match program without notice if deemed advisable. Competitors and spectators assume all risk of accident and loss of property.

AWARD SCHEDULE: Individual Matches (Saturday matches 1-7): CMP will provide Championship medals for the 3 high scoring competitors in Match 7 in Service and Civilian categories. Cash awards given to the winner and to the high scoring competitor in each class and category for all matches. There will be one place award for every five entries. If there are fewer than five entries in a category they will be combined with another category in the same class. If there are still fewer than five entries after combining all categories in a class, there will be no awards in that class. All competitors will be moved back to their respective category and combined with the next higher class, until a minimum of five competitors is achieved in the combined class. If there are fewer than five High Masters entered, they will compete for open awards only.

Team Match: Cash awards to the winning team and to the high team in each class and category, provided that five or more teams compete. Place awards will be made for every 5 additional teams within a class / category.

MATCH SCHEDULE:

THURSDAY, May 30, 9:00 AM Squadded Practice – Will be held on Thursday. Fired at 300 and 600 yards; 10 minutes each yard line for each relay, 200 yard relays "as requested" at completion of 300/600

FRIDAY, May 31, 9:00 AM **Team Match** - The 50 Shot National Match Course – Two sighting shots per competitor will be fired before each stage. Pair firing will be optional. Note this match will be converted to a 50 shot National Match Course individual match if there are insufficient team entries.

SATURDAY, JUNE 1, 9:00 AM **The Regional Championship Match 1** - 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target. **Match 2** - 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire, 200 yards, SR target. **Match 3** - 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, rapid fire, 300 yards, SR-3 target. **Match 4** - 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, 600 yards, MR-1 target. **Match 5** - The Slow Fire Aggregate: Total of scores fired in Matches 1 and 4. **Match 6** - The Rapid Fire Aggregate: Total of scores fired in Matches 2 and 3. **Match 7** - The Regional Championship Aggregate: Total of scores fired in Matches 5 and 6.

SUNDAY, JUNE 2, 9:00 AM CMP Service Rifle EIC Match – See CMP EIC program for match details.

A **National Match Course** will also be fired concurrently with the CMP EIC Match, following the same course of fire (50 shot National Match Course with no sighters.) This match is open to all individual competitors, using either the Match Rifle or the Service Rifle.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES: A Competitor Cookout and Awards Ceremony will be held at the ORSA Clubhouse immediately after the completion of firing on Saturday afternoon.
